<b>Afro</b>	bushy and frizzy	<b>dreadlocks</b>	Long twisted locks, typically worn by Rastafarian men
<b>bangs</b>	fringe cut straight across the forehead	<b>ducktail</b>	Hair backswept at the sides with a high tuft and a curl at the back, resembling a duck's tail popular among young men in the 1950s
<b>beehive</b>	piled up by backcombing	<b>Eton crop/shingle</b>	Cropped short in the manner of a schoolboy, popular with women in the 1920s
<b>bob</b>	Short even cut all around the head	<b>French pleat / French roll</b>	Cylindrical roll gathered at the back
<b>chignon</b>	Long hair rolled into a knot or bun at the back	<b>marcel wave</b>	Regular, tight waves set close to the head
<b>cornrows</b>	Tight parallel braids set close to the head, popular with African and Afro-American women	<b>Mohawk/Mohican</b>	Spiky sweep of hair down the center of an otherwise shaved head
<b>crew cut / en brosse</b>	Cut short and standing stiffly upright	<b>pageboy</b>	Straight hair with the ends curled gently inward, typically shoulder-length
<b>crimps</b>	Tight curls or waves	<b>pouf</b>	Piled high in rolled puffs, as worn by women in the 18th century
